I would make sure that our streets stayed safe by using gps technology to track known sex offenders so they would stay away from children and the women they assaulted. I will create a new program like medicare for all new yorkers so we can save money, have great care and make sure that no more hospitals close, and I would cut taxes by 10pct for anyone making less than \$150,000 a year and pay for It by asking millionaires to pay 1pct more and reforming government by eliminating 5% in waste each year. I wont make big promises but I can assure you of this — if you elect me mayor we will finally have someone at city hall who every day is fighting for the middle class and those struggling to make it there.
